**1. He provided for his family.**

“In the land of Uz there lived a man whose name was Job. This man was blameless and upright; he feared God and shunned evil. He had seven sons and three daughters, and he owned seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen and five hundred donkeys, and had a large number of servants. He was the greatest man among all the people of the East.” Job 1:1-3 (NIV)

**He provided a Godly example.**

“The godly walk with integrity; blessed are their children who follow them.” Proverbs 20:7 (NLT)

**2. He was present in their lives.**

“His sons used to hold feasts in their homes on their birthdays, and they would invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them.”  
Job 1:4 (NIV)

**- by disciplining them**

“Now his father, King David, had never disciplined him at any time, even by asking, ‘Why are you doing that?’” 1 Kings 1:6 (NLT)

“Those who spare the rod of discipline hate their children. Those who love their children care enough to discipline them.”

**- by being emotionally available to them**

**3. He served as priest of his home.**

“When a period of feasting had run its course, Job would make arrangements for them to be purified. Early in the morning he would sacrifice a burnt offering for each of them, thinking, ‘Perhaps my children have sinned and cursed God in their hearts. . .’” Job 1:5 (NIV)

“These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.” Deuteronomy 6:6-7 (NIV)
